The Finance Committee plans to submit the 2018 Budget at the October Church Council Meeting on October 23rd, rather than at the Charge Conference this year. This will allow us to adopt it as a *working budget* which can be amended at regular Council meetings. If we approve it at the Charge Conference it becomes an "official budget" which can only be altered through special called charge conference action. Finance Co-Chair, Tim Tryon, reports the 2018 budget of \$208,278 is less than a 1% overall increase from the 2017 budget.
