Greetings friends,

An attitude of gratitude – that is something we focus on in this season of Thanksgiving. It could certainly be argued that we should embrace that way of thinking throughout the year, especially in this land of plenty that we live in.

Two of the first terms we teach our children are “please” and “thank you”. For children who first learn to communicate with sign language, “please” and “thank you” often become a part of their vocabulary before they even become one-year-olds. And, as is often the case, they understand the terms before they sign them. Clearly, these words are important and help foster good relationships with our neighbors.

I find it curious then, that I’m hearing less and less of those two terms out in the world. It is shameful. It’s also a little embarrassing (and perhaps risky) to have to chide some kids, teenagers and even a few adults to remember to say “please” if they want something from me. My gentle, respectful reminder is often met with an embarrassed expression and apology. But sometimes I’ll get an eye roll along with a slightly sarcastic please, and occasionally and most sadly, I’ll receive a blank stare. Yikes! What is happening to our culture when such simple courtesy is abandoned? Notice I didn’t say “common courtesy” because, it seems like it is becoming less common all the time.

The only thing I can think to do is to keep modeling the kind of behavior I want to see in others myself. What we do and how we treat one another is noticed. It is important to choose to be polite and kind and to remember the earliest lessons learned as children. Being caring and courteous to our neighbors and loved ones is always in vogue and a precious something we should never abandon or outgrow.
