#### From Our Pastor



Beloveds,

In Roman mythology, Janus was a god with two heads that looked in opposite directions—one into the past, and one into the future. He was the god of gates, doors, entrances, and exits. His name comes from the Latin for "gate." He was prayed to at the beginning and end of every important action—especially war.

Of course, the month of January is named for him.

I know that many people don't want to look back, they insist that the past is the past and it is important to stride confidently into the future. Of course, I am an historian, and I am convinced that, as Churchill reportedly said, those who fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it. Even if the past is painful, why should we waste all that grief and not apply what we've learned to the here and now?

When Fred Darbonne was your pastor and transition specialist he led you through a process of evaluation and introspection that produced a big document entitled "Congregational Study, Strategic Priorities, and Implementation Plan" in 2017. A year later I was asked to read and familiarize myself with that document before I visited Grace United Methodist Church and met with the staff-parish relations committee for the first time. The next year I reviewed it with some of the church members and meant to do that yearly. Well, things got in the way.

In November and December of 2022 we asked members and friends of the congregation to complete the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT). We were more than pleased with the congregation's response—we received far more than the minimum required and exceeded the "best" number for a reliable interpretation. I am hoping some of us will sit down and try to digest the results of this survey, lay them side-by-side with the document you prepared in 2017, and look back and forward to get some idea where our church is now and where she could be in the future

I am inviting our church leadership and everyone in the congregation who is interested to attend a meeting at the church Sunday, January 8, at 5 p.m. when our CAT interpreter, Josh Smouse, will go over the raw data and give us some insight into the results. Please join us.
