From Our Pastor

Beloveds,

I remember attending confirmation classes in the Spring of 1970 (I think)—just a couple of years after we, Evangelical United Brethren, joined with the Methodists in response to our calling to form the United Methodist Church. Among the things I learned and remember today (as I tell my classes at Grace) is that grace is the free and unmerited love of God. I am sure Dad taught us many other things, too!

Confirmation is *relatively* new in the United Methodist tradition. That is, the word did not appear in our official documents until well after World War II. That is not to say local churches did not observe the practice before then—just look at the pictures of the classes in our fellowship hall! My first two churches in the Ozarks, however, were still not “doing” confirmation in the mid-1980s. I would guess it was because they were suspicious of anything that suggested faith might be “taught and not caught,” as I think Dad said once. My experience also tells me that such things depend on whether one’s neighbors are Southern Baptist or Lutheran.

We are planning to confirm several young people this month. I have appreciated everyone’s patience as we’ve had to struggle with my neck surgery and the church calendar. Ask the UMC.org says, “United Methodists use the term ‘confirmation’ to mark the first time a baptized Christian publicly ‘confirms’ their intention to live the vows of the baptismal and membership covenant and so becomes a professing member of the local congregation and The United Methodist Church.” Confirmation is one step along the life-long journey of faith that begins with baptism (at any age) and includes many moments of renewal and confirmation along the way. The newly confirmed Christians join the United Methodist Church and Grace United Methodist Church as full members.

Please continue to support these young people and their families (as we vowed to do at their baptisms) as they make a profession of faith and step out into their life of love and service in the name of Jesus Christ.

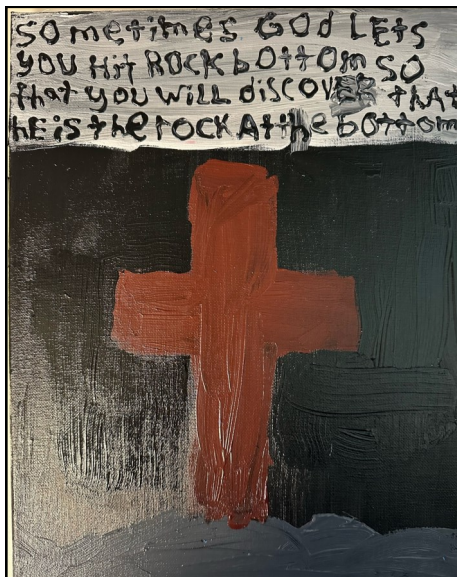


Mission Brunch

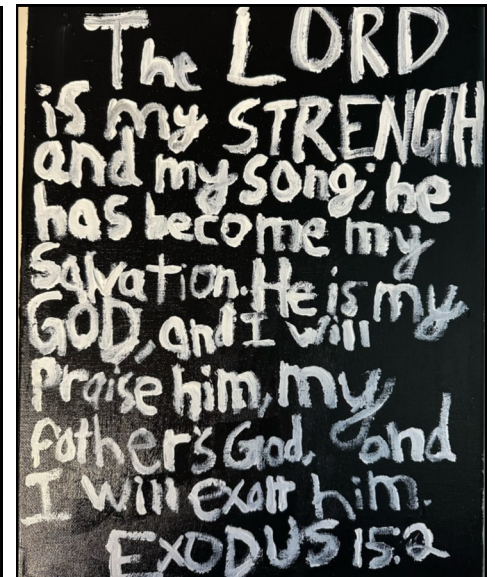

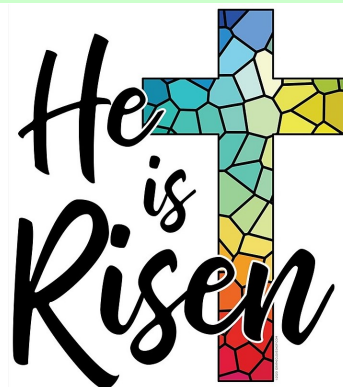

Apportionments

Apportionments are the fundamental method the church uses to fund mission and ministry beyond the local community. The United Methodist denomination, from the beginning, has been a church that believes congregations are to fund not only their local communities but beyond to the world parish. For the followers of John Wesley, ministry has never been about one or the other—always both.

In the Iowa Conference, our shared giving includes three areas:

1) *General Church Apportionments* = 21%; which supports the following: Episcopal Fund, Ministerial Education Fund, General Church Administration, North Central Jurisdictional Administration, Interdenominational Coop Fund, World Service Fund, Black College Fund, and Africa University.
2) *Conference Ministries* = 62%; which supports the following: Board of Ordained Ministries, Board of Trustees, Commission on Equitable Compensation, District/Cabinet Funds, Clergy Support Ministries, Episcopal Funds, Pastoral Care and Counseling, Conference Administrative Committees, Council on Finance and Administration, Connectional Ministries, Council Commission on Archives and History, and Communications.
3) *Conference Missions* = 17%; which supports the following: Board of Camp, Conference and Retreat Ministries, Board of Church and Society, Board of Discipleship, Board of Global Ministries, Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministries, Board of Laity, Commission on Religion and Race, District Councils on Ministries, and Matthew 25 Fund.

Inclement Weather

When there is a weather related early out at Roland-Story schools, all church activities for that day will also be cancelled. Jonathan offered prayer and Gloria opened the meeting.

Cheryl/Gini moved the February minutes be accepted. Motion carried.

Finance: Becky reported the church remains in good financial condition. Paying two months of apportionments in March (we've paid 6 months of 2023 at this point). Giving was down a bit in March, hoping to get back on track with 5 Sundays in April..

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jonathan shared:

End of year reports have been submitted – thanks to Lorijo, Becky, and Candi for completing their reports

Wednesday night Devotional services have gone well, regular attenders

On March 30 he will attend an Orders (Clergy) Retreat – will hear about trauma survivors & how to help

HOLY WEEK – On April 6 he (with the Kiwanis) will participate in Team Maze with RS students in the AM – Maundy

Thursday service at 7:00 in the evening.

April 8 will participate (along with the Kiwanis) in the community Bunny Trail Easter Egg Hunt

Summer – may go to Colorado to help confirm a great-niece.

Health – receiving attention on eye and tooth concerns

Committee Reports: Ministry Areas

Worship: Cheryl reported church pianos be shifted around this summer when a new one is due to be donated. It will go into the choir room – the choir room piano will be given away. The electronic piano stored in the choir room will move to the chapel and the existing chapel piano will be given away. Cathy moved the plan be adopted with a second from Becky – motion carried. Cheryl reported Kurt Carlson has reserved space at Little Wall Lake for the July 9th weekend for the 6th annual All Church Camp-out. We have two weddings set for this summer at Grace and a baptism set for April 2nd.

Christian Education: Gini reported plans are set for Palm Sunday. April 16th after worship Confirmation pictures will be taken. Confirmation is set for April 23 with a reception following the service. Four students will be confirmed –Owen Hubert, Emma Larson, Isabelle Ness, Riker Warwick. There will be no Confirmation class for 2023-24 school year. We have one student graduating on May 21st and will have a reception following the service that day.

Missions: Gloria reported \$403.31 was given for the in-church *Caring Fund/Good Neighbor* account to be used as needed. \$296.50 was given to the *Middle School RS Food Pantry*. Next Grace-led turn at the *Loaves & Fishes Pantry* on April 22nd. Claudia has retired from leading our *Meals on Wheels* program (she has held the responsibility since 2012). She has developed materials to help the next person hit the ground running. UWF took the money given for *RSHS Clothing Closet* (around \$400) and bought requested needed supplies to give to the Closet. A grant application for Loaves & Fishes has been submitted to Ingathering program. Work has begun on initiating hands-on missional opportunities for interested members. *Prayer Shawls Ministry* – three shawls and a baptism shawl were shared. \$511 was raised at the March Mission Brunch for *Heifer Project*. That donation will be doubled through a special Heifer program offered in the month of March.

UFW - Patsy reported Grace Church has again responded by providing volunteers to help serve at the Senior Citizens Wednesday meal.

Committee Reports: Administrative Area

SPRC: Krystal reported a new form to replace “Another Set of Eyes” will be the project at the April SPRC meeting.

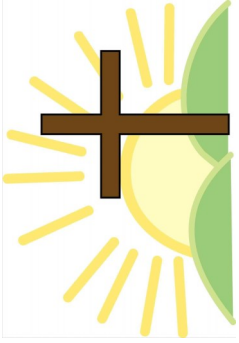
Trustees: Louis reported further investigation into the office water problem has revealed the grade outside the Pastor's office may need to be changed before a landscaping project is begun. Also extensions to the down spouts are being tried to help alleviate the problem. The carpet just outside the choir loft has been stretched. A bid for the lighting project has been received which will allow for bulbs to be changed to LED and some rewiring to be completed on the rheostats in the lighting closet. Enlisting the help of Loyal Winborn, work continues for updating the sound/monitors for the sanctuary. One bid has been received (awaiting a 2nd bid) for updating the back parking lot.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Discussed ways to address some socialization needs uncovered by the CAT survey. Church Committees will look for opportunities within their purviews for encouraging more missional opportunities. A few ideas we will explore at our next meeting include: Group of Eight dinners – a yearlong program that folks sign up to participate in. Cribbage Nights (afternoons), Painting and other classes, Summer services followed by a grilled hamburger potluck meal.
