Youth Update

We have a lot going on in the youth right now! Compass is seeing roughly the same numbers as usual (12-15) and Axis has been seeing a more consistent 2-4. I started writing my own lessons for Compass because I feel like they pay attention more when it comes from me and the Lord and not a different content source.

I am trying to work with Conner Freerks, the youth director from Immanuel to get a retreat set up in January where the theme will be relentless. Friday night Conner will talk about how God relentlessly pursues us, and Saturday morning I will talk about how we can return the favor and relentlessly pursue him back.

We had our community youth worship night on Wednesday, November 15. A night where we partnered with Harvest E-free and Immanuel to bring the youth in our community together to understand that even though we go to different churches, we worship the same God. We had about 50 to 60 kids plus 10 to 15 adults. We are looking to try and do it again with neighboring communities in the spring!

Finally, I want to announce that I am resigning from my position as the Youth and Families ministries director effective December 31 of this year. I have the opportunity to intern at Riverside Lutheran Bible Camp as a communications intern in order to graduate from college. I am praying for the hiring process for the church and just ask for some prayers about what is next for me. 


Poinsettias



Unofficial Minutes from November 27, 2023 Meeting

Present: Gloria Sampson (Chair, Missions), Becky Barclay (Finance), Jim Hassebrock (Trustees), Louis Reeder (Trustees), Pastor Jonathan, Cheryl Semler (Worship), Krystle Ness (SPRC), Claudia Pauk (Lay Leader)

Jonathan offered prayer and Gloria opened the meeting.

Cheryl/Becky Moved the November minutes be accepted as written. Motion carried.

Finance: Becky reported an account is being setup with "Donor Box" to enable electronic giving by scanning a QR code for mission breakfasts or coffee hour. A separate account is setup with the bank for these donations, there is no monthly fee or contract. Upon donation a small fee will be charged and the donor can either chose to cover the fee on top of their donation or the fee will be deducted from the donation. The conference reached out to all member churches in regards to connectional apportionment gifting, asking if other congregations would like to make an additional apportionment payment to make up for other conference churches that were unable to pay their apportionments in entirety. The committee voted to make an additional \$1200 apportionment payment to the conference.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jonathan reported the church conference was held on November 5 at Collegiate in Ames. There are copies of the leadership report and budgets available in the narthex. Full packets are available if desired; check with the office. Two changes were made after the packets were printed, but in time to be voted on at the conference. Lay leader will be Dave Dolittle and Virginia Swenson will attend annual conference. Joel Chambers (youth leader) has resigned his position effective at the end of December. There will be a youth committee meeting at Grace church on December 10 at 11:30 am.

Committee Reports: Ministry Area

Worship: Cheryl reported satisfaction with the All Saints service on November 5. The committee decided to purchase a new, smaller tree that would not obstruct the new monitor and are satisfied with the result. Worship chose to use their budget to cover the cost of the tree. December 3 will be communion. On Christmas Eve there will be two services, the morning worship at 9:15 am and a special Christmas Eve service at 5:30 pm. Pianos will be tuned in January.

Missions: Gloria reported: The mission brunch raised \$823.50 on November 19th for Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry. The check and an additional 100 pounds of food were delivered before Thanksgiving. There are 5 church members going to Midwest Missions on Thursday, November 30 to volunteer their time. They will deliver the 4 finished mats from Grace church.

UWF: Gloria reported the December brunch will benefit the Taylor Family. The second week of December the members will be doing their cookie exchange and visits to shut-in friends. The members have been working the senior luncheons at the community center.

Committee Reports: Administrative Area

SPRC: Krystle reported staff appreciation on November 12 went well; staff were presented with cinnamon rolls and card thanking them for their service. Next meeting will be in January.

Leadership: Jonathan reported the leadership reports for 2024 are available in the narthex.

Trustees: Annual parsonage inspection was completed and identified a rotten window frame that will be replaced by the end of the year using funds allocated for parsonage maintenance. The lighting project in the sanctuary is mostly done, waiting on re-ordered bulbs and light fixtures to finish. Due to changes in implementation, there was additional funds left that will be used to replace lighting in the narthex and choir room. Cleanup days took place on November 10 & 11; leaves were raked and removed and pews were vacuumed throughout the sanctuary. A new monitor bracket was purchased and will be installed with the front monitor to allow it to pivot to help cut down on glare from the windows. The committee is looking into handicap accessibility buttons on the North and West entrances.

Unfinished Business: December 8 & 12 Shannon will be out of the office. The church office will be closed on December 25 & 26. The Girl Scouts troop will be meeting at the church on December 9th for a party. The Boy Scouts troop will be meeting and staying overnight at the church on December 15.

Gloria adjourned meeting at 7:15.

Next meeting will be Monday, January 22 at 6:30 pm.
