

Beloveds,

After several failed attempts to hold the 2020 general conference of the United Methodist Church the plan is to hold the next meeting of our denomination's policy-making body April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina. The aborted 2020 and 2022 general conferences were to be held in Minneapolis and I had signed up to be a volunteer. COVID-19 and difficulties obtaining visas for some of our members made these meetings difficult if not impossible to bring to fruition. A world-wide Zoom call with critical voting is not practical. Needless to say, I am not going to Charlotte.

I don't think much of substance will come out of the first few days of the meeting. My understanding is that committee work is done before proposals make it to the floor for discussion. National news outlets are bound to cover it. I would also recommend the United Methodist News Service at www.umnews.org. There is more information at <u>www.umc.org</u> and I am sure one or both of these services will stream the plenary sessions. On the official general conference website you can subscribe to the <u>Daily Christian Advocate</u> (<u>General</u> <u>Conference 2020 (resourceumc.org</u>)

The church held a special general conference in 2019 to address LGBTQ+ issues and although that meeting resulted in a reinforcement of the traditional language in our Book of Discipline, not everyone was exceptionally pleased with the outcome. As many of you know, it led to a disaffiliation protocol which allowed many of our churches and clergy to leave the church. I have been told we can expect more of that discussion this year, too. Other topics should include a proposed plan for regionalization which is meant to allow our churches and conferences to operate more effectively within their various settings globally. Some of this already occurs as the *Book of Discipline* requires the United Methodist Church to obey local laws.

Let us be in prayer for all of these people as they join in prayer, discussion, and mission.

Discussed was an idea about meeting at Timberland or Cedar Place. More discussion will follow at future meetings.


Patsy laid out cards to be sent to our shut-ins, we were asked to take one and send it.
















Dear Rev. Cooney and Story City, Grace United Methodist Church,


God's grace and peace to you! I am writing today to celebrate that your congregation has paid 100% of apportioned giving for 2023! I am so proud.

Grace UMC Council Unofficial Minutes from March 25, 2024 Meeting

Present: Pastor Jonathan, Becky Barclay (Finance), Jim Hassebrock (Trustees), Cheryl Semler (Worship) Patsy Jensen (UMF), Jan Feil (Missions), Lauren Crawford (SPRC), Gini Michel (Education)

* Jonathan offered a prayer and then opened the meeting.

* Minutes: Gini / Cheryl moved that the February minutes be accepted as written. Motion carried.

* **Finance**: Becky reported the church is in great standing with our apportionments. The church received \$30,000 from our insurance company for the flood. Monies received from the February Brunch paid for the deductible. The Conference contacted the church regarding their Scholar Camping Campaign. After discussion, Patsy made a motion & Jim seconded to give \$500.00 toward the campaign. Motion carried. The money will be taken out of the church's Camp Fund.

* **Pastor's Report**: Pastors from Bergen Lutheran, St. Petri, and Grace interviewed someone for the Youth Leadership position. The individual was offered and accepted the position.

Committee Reports: Ministry Areas

* **Worship**: The GRACE TEAMS appreciate Shannon folding the weekly bulletins and monthly newsletter as well as changing the activity sheets to the children's clipboards. Transition from Pastor Jonathan to Pastor Jena is July 1, with Pastor Jonathan serving until then. Parsonage move be the 2nd week of June. Pastor Jonathan will talk to Pastor Jena about a Sunday service in the parsonage backyard this summer.

* Education: We're in our final quarter of Sunday school. At the end of our Sunday school year, all materials stored in the Fellowship Hall will be moved to the Early Childhood - 1st room in preparation for Scandinavian Days. 1 family has registered their children for Wesley Woods Camp. The Little Wall Lake camping (6 camp sites) and Sunday church service is scheduled for Aug. 22 - 25.

* **Missions**: The March Brunch + the Quarter Tube raised \$676.74. This money went toward the Heifer Project. Monies raised at the upcoming April Brunch (French toast) will go toward the World-Wide Mobility Project. Grace Church is in charge of Loaves & Fishes April 27.

* **UWF**: It was suggested that the church invite Pastor Jena to Scandinavian Days.

Committee Reports: Administration Areas

* **SPRC**: The Ministry Appraisal Report is being prepared and due May 1. It was suggested that SPRC spearhead (with help from parishioners) "Thank You Pastor Jonathan" and "Welcome, Pastor Jena" celebration

* **Trustees**: The church has received insurance monies to pay for some of our expenses, such as replacing furniture. Chris Feil is spearheading the floor replacement (planks) in the Chapel. Letters for the Grace Church Capital Campaign fundraiser will be going out soon.
